Historical Society Presents Its Holiday House Tour

The Garden City Historical Society is pleased to announce that is reviving its lively and well-attended Holiday House Tour, which will take place on Thursday, December 13, beginning at 5p.m. A limited number of tickets at \$75 per person will be sold for the House Tour.

All guests will begin at the Cathedral of the Incarnation, where they will be assigned a tour group. The Cathedral's Dean, The Very Reverend Michael Sniffen, will conduct a special tour of the magnificent church and the museum in the crypt. Guests will then visit the Episcopal Diocese See House (aka the Bishop's Residence). Using their own cars, guests then proceed to three elegant, historic homes in the Central Section. At each home, fully decorated for Christmas and the Holidays, homeowners will tell guests a little about the history of their homes. Following the tour, guests will be welcomed at The Garden City Historical Society Museum for a cocktail reception, entertainment and holiday shopping at the Society's A. T. Stewart Exchange consignment shop.

No children under 12 years of age and no photographs permitted on the tour.
